With the end of term fast approaching, and hopefully some summer weather, I hope you are all as well as can be. I say this as I know that a number of our parents are currently dealing with Covid and sincerely wish you all a speedy recovery.

We are seeing now an increase in cases within the local area, at what seems quite a fast rate, with many parents, carers and pupils finding they are positive having not had any of the main symptoms. This is a stark reminder that we need to do all we can to keep ourselves and all around us safe.

With this in mind, I know many of you will be looking forwards to the restrictions lifting on Monday 19th July. There has been much in the news about this and the changes that this will mean for schools. In many reports I have seen, and posts on social media, it seems a false message is being portrayed that schools will return to normal on the 19th. This is not the case. Firstly, many schools in the country finish this week. Many of the measures are from 19th July it seems with the presumption that most schools will have broken up for Summer. For us, this is not the case. Some of the information in the school guidance that does not seem to have found it's way to the headlines is that where school term does not end until after 19th July, schools should consider keeping current procedures in place until the end of term. This is exactly what we will be doing at Fitzwilliam Primary School. We see no point in putting people's summers further at risk by removing all measures in place, particularly when it is quite obvious that the local area is experiencing a large increase in positive cases. Therefore, one-way systems, social distancing whilst on the playground, bubbles for children, staff wearing masks whilst moving around in school and the staggered timings will all be in place up until and including 28th July.

We are aware that we cannot instruct parents and carers to wear face coverings on the playground but would welcome the decision to do so by anyone who chooses to as we are well aware that when entering and exiting gates, people are in close proximity and also some people do cut through the socially distanced queues as well much closer than some people feel comfortable with in the current climate.

We do intend moving back to usual school timings when we return in September, with classrooms arranged in a way that we are all more familiar with but for now, we are counting on the support and understanding of you all for one last push to see us through to the summer holidays.

After I wrote the above, schools in Wakefield received a communication from the Director of Public Health, who confirmed much of the above, citing the fact that Wakefield currently has the highest rate of infection in West Yorkshire. Please see the extracts from the letter below. Please do not add to our workload, which is currently extremely high due to being left with limited staff due to isolations and recording and reporting positive cases, by disputing any measures with any member of school staff. Our procedures are in place to keep you and your children as safe as we can.

'Cases of COVID-19 in Wakefield are rising steeply. The District currently has the highest case rate in West Yorkshire, with particularly high rates for school and college age children and young people.'

We would therefore strongly advise you to maintain your existing risk assessment and current arrangements for minimising mixing of different groups of children and staff, in order to reduce transmission and the number of families needing to isolate into the summer holidays. The legal requirement for contacts under 18 to isolate will not change until 16 August.

While the formal responsibility for undertaking contact tracing will pass to NHS Test and Trace from 19 July, it is not clear how it will operate and whether contacts will be reached in a timely manner. We would strongly advise you to continue with your current contact tracing arrangements until the end of this term.'

If you have already done so you do not need to fill this out again.

We would be grateful if you could complete these surveys if they apply to you but would like as many parents, carers and pupils to complete the annual surveys to find out what you think about our school and how we can improve it.

Sports Day Events

Over the course of the last three weeks, we planned to hold sports events for each class. Children will complete a series of sports activities throughout the day. All children will need to come in PE kit / sportswear for these days. Parents will be informed of when your child's Sports Day is via e:mail and on Twitter as they will be weather dependent. Unfortunately, class isolations have already affected some class' days and we know that this could be a further problem. Due to restrictions we will be keeping in place, parents are not invited to these events. As well as being an increased safety risk, the events will take place across the full school day, not just a morning or afternoon.

Year 1 had their sports event this week and it was a great success. I am sure the same will be said about the other year groups.

We hope to return to usual arrangements next Summer.

Summer Clubs

Over the summer, there is the opportunity to attend some local summer clubs and other resources if you are interested for your children. Please see the attached information for more details.

Summer Support from Wakefield Council

We are pleased to confirm the Covid-19 Local Support grant has been extended for summer 2021.

The decision has been made at the resident recovery board to split the allocation of funding as follows

· Approx. 17,500 children will receive a one off voucher of £60 for summer holidays 2021

The £60 voucher will be sent week commencing 19 July direct to the homes of eligible children, as we have done for previous holiday periods. There is a process in place for families who do not have access to either a smart phone or e mail address via the Help at the Hubs which has been successfully used by families for previous voucher runs.

PE Kit

It has been a longstanding and well received gesture that school purchases a PE kit for every pupil each year. As we stated at the start of the school year that we would do this again this year, we will ensure that pupils are provided with a PE kit ready for their PE lessons in September. However, this will need to be the final year we are able to do this. It was only recently announced that schools would be receiving sports funding for next academic year. Without the funding, the PE kit would not be able to be purchased. As this is an unsustainable gesture for future years, we will not be able to do this in the future years. We would encourage parents and carers to send in any old PE kit when we return in September so that we can build up a bank of spare kit.

Next year, pupils will come to school in their PE kit and stay in this all day, to avoid getting changed in and out of it and save valuable time – particularly for the younger children.



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Gifts for staff

Some parents and carers have enquired about gifts for staff members. We do not want to offend anyone by refusing these but must consider current procedures. Therefore, we will accept gifts in a similar way to last year. Gifts can be placed in a box by the entrance door where staff can leave them 48 hours before collecting.

We would like to reiterate though that no gifts are necessary. We adore teaching your children and your support and understanding throughout this last 18 months has been a gift in itself and we cannot thank you all enough.

Reading Books

Please can all school reading books be sent back to school from Monday 19th July. We need to put these back in the centrally stored areas over summer ready to organise for September.

Pupil Work Books

Next week, we will be sending home some of your children's exercise books. We would ask that your child comes to school with a plastic bag on Monday. It will go straight in their drawer, left for 48 hours and then the children can put their books in and bring them home.

Currently, Crofton still intend holding their induction day on Tuesday 20th July. Please contact school if you have not received information about this. Children are expected to be there at 8:45 and the day runs until 3pm. You should have received an e:mail yesterday morning regarding this.

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

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We want to wish Miss Crossley all the best as she leaves us temporarily on maternity leave.

If your child is in UFS, Y1 or Y2, they are eligible for Universal FSM but you can still apply if you think you are eligible for income-related free school meals. If your child is in Year 2 and receiving universal free school meals, please remember that this will stop when they move into Year 3, so please ensure you have applied if you think you eligible.

School receives additional funding for the number of pupils in receipt of free school meals and it has never been as important as it is now to try to provide crucial interventions to help pupils catch up – any additional funding will help us to achieve this goal.
