

Year 6 Curriculum Learning Overview - Spring 2021 Crime and Punishment

Please find below an overview of your child's learning and open ended homework this term. If you require more detail, please see the subject planning documents available on the website.

English

We will be developing our skills to show greater control in our writing. Year 6 will be looking at writing information texts, letters and a balanced argument, as well as exploring our new class novel, Holes.

Mathematics

We will be developing our knowledge of fractions, decimals and percentages. We will also be exploring brand new areas of maths such as algebra.

Science

Living Things and Their Habitats

We will be developing our knowledge and understanding of how different plants and animals are classified.

History

Crime and Punishment

In History, we will be exploring how crimes, and how they are dealt with, have evolved over time in Britain.

Geography

America and Earthquakes

We will be learning about the structure of the Earth and how this results in earthquakes. We will also be exploring North and South America.

Design

Electrical Systems

In DT, we will be exploring how we can use computers to control electrical components. We will use this knowledge to design a working fairground ride.

Art

Banksy

We will be finding out about the life and art of the illusive graffiti artist, Banksy. We will be creating printed designs similar to his style.

We will be exploring the genre of classical music and how artists use different techniques and instruments to create unique and memorable sounds.

We will be learning about the non-religious beliefs of Humanists and comparing this to Christianity.

We will be learning about different ways to control a character in a game. We will apply this to creating our own games using Scratch.

Year 6 Open-ended Homework - Spring 2021 Crime and Punishment

Children should complete at least one piece of homework from the suggestions below but they can do as many as they would like or may create their own project linked to the curriculum work. Homework can be brought in or posted on Seesaw at any point during the term. It will be shared in class that week and they will receive and appropriate number of stars.

In addition to this, children will have the following weekly homework:

English: Your child will have a weekly English activity to complete each week, linked to punctuation and grammar. Children will be expected to read at home regularly each week and also practise their weekly spellings in preparation for weekly spelling test each Friday.

Mathematics: A mathematics activity to help practise their arithmetic will also be set each week. Practising times tables at home, which can include using Times Tables Rockstars, is also expected.

Homework will be set every Friday and is expected to be returned by the following Friday at the latest. Children will be rewarded with stars for returning homework early and those not returning homework will complete in school on the following Friday. Please support your child with your chosen homework and enjoy learning with your child.
